Honestly, I don't know how you manage to stay so calm.</p> <p>I made notes of Mr. Garcia's presentation tonight, in which he claimed that 154 plus 674 add up to 768. They do not, they add to 828, and as a result he continues to overestimate the acceptable enrollment.</p> <p>Actually, what immediately struck me is that 154 and 674 were supposed to be 20% and 80% of X .. some number, doesn't matter which, and therefore they should be in ratio 1 to 4, which they are obviously not. I really didn't have to do any math.</p> <p>I approached Mr. Garcia to check that it was 674 that he was working with, but he didn't understand this 1 to 4 thing, and just claimed I didn't know how to multiply. Which might be true. As I said, I detected the error without needing to multiply.</p> <p>Not wanting to debate my arithmetic skills, I used a calculation to get the correct number of 614. Whether it was him or me, one of us made the error of changing a "1" to a "7". I'm sure he has deposited his new presentation with you, and we can check this.</p> <p>Whatever that may be, going with the suggestion of 28 car stack, and three dismissals, the new equation is:</p> $614 * 84 / 97 = 531$ <p>Now, you may not know that in the past two years Somerset schools had to be evacuated for bomb scares. The details, if you care, are available by googling "Somerset hand grenade". I am not a civil engineer or a city planner, I have an undergraduate in electrical engineering and advanced degrees in computer science, but I would imagine one would</p>

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						<p>want to derate the 531 number in consideration that after an evacuation, or for a hurricane, you will have a rare but foreseeable event where you do not achieve staggered dismissal. What amount one should derate, I don't know. But 80% sounds about right, giving a number of about 425.</p> <p>I know that you have your experts to rely on for these numbers, but the wrongness of these numbers just popped out at me. I am unable to attend the meeting as I have been called out of town on that day for a family matter.</p> <p>I am writing to you so that I can express my thoughts on this matter.</p> <p>My husband and I have owned our home down the street from UBC at 3260 Riviera Dr., for over 30 years. It has been a joy to live in Coral Gables and particularly on this beautiful street. We have lovingly invested our time, energy and finances in improving and maintaining our home in a way that is always consistent with the rules and regulations of the city of Coral Gables. We have played by the book and have felt deep gratitude to the city for keeping our standard of living so lovely here.</p> <p>Now we are being faced with the possibility that the UBC site will house a school of over 700 children if Somerset/Academia gets their request to change the zoning in a way that would allow a dramatic increase in the approved size of the school.</p> <p>I find myself asking why this should be allowed when there are so many facets of the change that would work to the detriment of the community at large.</p> <p>The first and most obvious issue is that of traffic. I am sure that the school will be able to pay their experts to come up with a traffic study that will downplay the issue of traffic, but it defies logic to think that having over 700 children dropped off and picked up daily will not lead to an increase in traffic that will potentially be hazardous. The traffic will most certainly be a nuisance. And, of importance to me and the surrounding neighbors, will definitely decrease the value of our homes.</p> <p>Next is the issue of what a change in zoning for this piece of property might mean in the long term future. Apparently the requested change can open up that location to occupants that are terribly contrary to the peaceful enjoyment the neighborhood now shares. The thought of a fire station or electric station down the block from our house is most unpleasant. How can it be fair that we purchased our home knowing exactly what was here in our long established neighborhood and then we get the rug pulled out from under</p>

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						<p>us with this potential change?</p> <p>I also don't understand how it is allowable that the area residents will be made to suffer with the opening of a for profit charter school in Coral Gables when most of the student body of the school is from outside of Coral Gables. And, Coral Gables already has three public elementary schools, some of which are under enrolled.</p> <p>The addition of all of these children to this area will most certainly lead to a greater use of the nearby community facilities built for Coral Gables residents. We greatly enjoy going to the library and using the Youth Center and welcome others using these wonderful facilities. However, it seems reasonable to assume that these facilities will experience a large increase in use from children attending Sommerset Academy at school dismissal time because of the proximity of the school to these facilities. There will not be a way to stagger the numbers as they are now with children coming from all over.</p> <p>Last, I see the whole concept of charter schools as worthy of long term evaluation and potentially greater implementation. But, charter schools are for profit businesses. Given that fact and the previous location of such schools in non-residential neighborhoods, why shouldn't Somerset pick a spot that does not harm the community? Real estate is at low point. There must be another spot where this school can be successfully located. University Baptist has assured us that they are financially solvent without Somerset and that wonderful church will hopefully continue to thrive with or without a 700+ student school. We had a great turnout. We certainly showed Goliath that this David is not going away!</p> <p>The hearing will continue on May 11th at 6:00 PM at the Youth Center Auditorium. Please come and hear our attorney, Tucker Gibbs, tell our side of the story. Please mark your calendars and try to arrive before 5:30 PM for adequate seating.</p>

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						<p>Public comments will also be heard at the next meeting. This is your opportunity to express your reasons for opposing the zoning change. To speak you must fill out a speaker card that are available before the meetings starts.</p> <p>We were generally pleased with the outcome of last night's meeting. City Staff recommended against the requested increase in student numbers. They seem to fully share our concerns in this matter. Eric Riel, Planning Director, showed clearly the disastrous impact of a larger school to the neighborhood and surrounding areas. The images presented spoke volumes: traffic, trash, safety issues, and degradation of the swales.</p> <p>Also, the Coral Gables traffic consultant refuted the traffic report put forward by Academica. Although no alternative numbers were given, we are hopeful that now everyone one knows what has been obvious from the start: this location cannot accommodate more students than St. Phillips or Granada Presbyterian.</p> <p>However while recommending against the requested increase in student numbers, City Staff recommended in favor of the comprehensive plan amendment that would change the zoning of the property from "Religious/Institutional" to "Community Services and Facilities". It is very important for protecting our neighborhood to argue persuasively against this change. The BNA legal position that will be presented at the next hearing by Mr. Gibbs is to deny any amendment to the comprehensive plan.</p> <p>We are ready and willing to fight this to the end in order to preserve the integrity of our neighborhood. Your support is necessary. Academica is well funded for this fight, sadly by your tax dollars! They are well connected, with friends and relatives on important legislative committees. Also I have entered the traffic data into a spread sheet. By a more complete graph of the data, superimposing car arrival, departure, dismissal and queue data, I believe I have found support for the Coral Gables expert's interpretation of the data.</p>


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					<p>To review:</p> <p>What is transpired is that the traffic study by Mr. Garcia was refuted by the Coral Gables' expert. It appears that Mr. Garcia: (1) accepted that his study was flawed and (2) presented a new analysis at the first planning meeting. The power point slides of the new analysis have been posted, but (3) there is no in-depth analysis submitted as a formal document to support Mr. Garcia's new conclusion?</p> <p>* Did I correctly understand on those three points?</p> <p>Moving forward from that:</p> <p>Mr. Garcia says (1) he now employs the area under the curve method. He also claims on the power points that (2) the data does not corroborate that the surrogate has three dismissals. His power point provides only for two dismissals. He as given without a full written report a new capacity number of 585 students.</p> <p>* Will Mr. Garcia be filing a full report to justify the 585 number?</p> <p>There does seem to be at least corroborations in the data of the 2:30 PM dismissal (the missing dismissal according to Mr. Garcia):</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. The curve of queue length bends from approximately 30 degree rise to 70 degree rise at about 2:38 PM, marking some new regime, possibly the end of the second dismissal and the increased arrival rate of cars for the third dismissal. 2. There is a cluster of cars leaving the site starting precisely at 2:30 PM and extending to 2:40 PM. <p>I have copied the data provided for the Doral Academy site into a spread sheet and made additional calculations, allowing me to graph not just the stacking but the cumulative cars-in and cumulative cars-out numbers, shown as a fraction of their total, that causes the stacking.</p> <p>At 3:01 PM the fraction of cars that have left the site (red line) is equal to the fraction of students that have been dismissed prior to the 3:00 PM dismissal (green line). By and large those cars left the site with students dismissed prior to the 3:00 PM dismissal and therefore the stacking at that point is by and large only cars waiting for students in the last dismissal. This is supportive of the Coral Gables expert's opinion that uses 484 as the number of students responsible for the stacking of 97 cars.</p> <p>There is significant number of cars leaving the property between time interval Mr. Garcia marks at 2:14 PM and the peak stacking at 2:58 PM; in fact, 20% of the cars leave during that period, and 20% of the student population is about 150 students. It seems that Mr. Garcia's method assumes those students participate in the 3:00 PM stacking even though</p>

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						<p>they have already left the premises.</p> <p>Furthermore, given (1) the large fluctuations in the final number that are made by small differences in assumptions, (2) the possibility that stacking will be less efficient in the confines of the Somerset Gables parking lot, which will most likely be single lane, (3) the stochastic nature of the stacking process and data collection, (4) general and standard engineering prudence; and (5) that a number once given cannot be reduced after a negative experience but can easily be increased by positive experience; I would apply a factor of 70% to any derived number.</p>

Our latest information is the article published in the Sunday, May 1, 2011 issue of The Miami Herald's Neighbors.</p>

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						<p>As related in the article which covered the public meeting held Wednesday night, April 27, 2011 by the Coral Gables Planning & Zoning Board, which is to be followed by another public meeting on Friday, May 6, 2011, it seems the discussions have zeroed in on the following issues: (a) change in zoning, which has been approved by Planning & Zoning and (b) traffic which has not been approved by Planning & Zoning.</p> <p>Succinctly, our views on the issues are: (a) Zoning change - while we do not fully understand the "whys, wherefores or nuances" of this, we are favourably inclined to the decision taken with the proviso it does not open up another "can of worms" and (b) Traffic - we agree whole heartedly with the decision taken. In this connection, while reviewing this matter, has anybody taken a look at what we consider to be an analogous case? We refer to Ste Teresa School at the confluence of Indian Mound, Sevilla and Anastasia streets where on a daily basis when school lets out, although handled reasonably well with the participation of Coral Gables Police Officers, the streets are blocked and traffic is impeded. It proposes to change a church property's zoning and intensity of use that will affect nearby single family home owners' quality of life. Without its acceptance by a majority of nearby single family home owners, the entire proposal should be denied. Otherwise, it will set a precedent for changing intensity and use of all religious properties in Coral Gables.</p> <p>The argument that allowing the application is in the public interest would set an overly broad precedent for any property's zoning change in the future. Such reasoning could allow spot zoning changes that would lead to commercialization of residential neighborhoods. It may be in the public interest for a gas station to be built at the</p>

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						<p>intersection of two busy streets in a residential neighborhood. However, that would not be in the best interest of nearby property owners. It would take value from their property without just compensation.</p> <p>Coral Gables has little vacant land in its boundaries for commercial uses. Allowing the proposed changes will set the stage for destroying Coral Gables' quality of life. 


